

TRANSPORTATION COORDINATORS' AUTOMATED INFORMATION FOR
MOVEMENT SYSTEM II (TC-AIMS II)
MATERIEL FIELDING AGREEMENT (MFA)
BETWEEN
PROGRAM MANAGER, TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION SYSTEMS (TIS)
AND
US ARMY FORCES COMMAND (FORSCOM)

1. **PURPOSE.** This Materiel Fielding Agreement (MFA) documents concurrence of the Program Management Office, Transportation Coordinators' Automated Information for Movement System II (TC-AIMS II) and Headquarters, US Army Forces Command (FORSCOM). This MFA is the primary governing document for the deployment and fielding of TC-AIMS II system under the Army's Transformation Plan to the US Army Forces Command.

2. **SCOPE.** This MFA becomes a part of the (final) Materiel Fielding Plan (MFP) when signed by the authorized representatives of the deployment and fielding command and the gaining command. It applies to deployment and fielding of TC-AIMS II to FORSCOM unless otherwise stated herein or until this MFA is superseded.

3. **POLICY.** Deployment and fielding of TC-AIMS II system to FORSCOM units will be accomplished using methods and procedures of AR 700-142 as outlined in the Materiel Fielding Plan.

4. **RESPONSIBILITIES.**

a. PM TC-AIMS II will:

(1) Finalize the TC-AIMS II Materiel Fielding Plan and upon approval, incorporate this MFA. Copies of the final MFP will be furnished to FORSCOM for distribution to the gaining units as final agreements are concluded. Changes and/or updates to the MFP are expected to occur and will be provided to the Major Command for distribution.

(2) Conduct New Materiel Introductory Briefs and installation (site) surveys to ensure the gaining units are prepared to receive the TC-AIMS II systems.

(3) Acquire and deploy TC-AIMS II systems to units identified by FORSCOM. Provide a Chief of Installation (COI) to coordinate the deployment, fielding and training efforts between PM TC-AIMS II and representatives from the gaining Major Command and applicable contractor personnel.

(4) Monitor the hardware shipment and coordinate required delivery dates with the gaining units. Government acceptance will include a joint inventory and a functional examination of the delivered system.

(5) Coordinate and provide New Equipment Training (NET) for the gaining units.

(6) Provide initial logistics support for the TC-AIMS II systems.

b. FORSCOM:

(1) Appoint a Major Command (MACOM) single Point of Contact (POC) for the TC-AIMS II deployment and fielding, on-site for each site fielding.

(2) Provide facilities and services as required in the Materiel Fielding Plan.

(3) Accomplish the necessary site preparation as required in the Materiel Fielding Plan.

(4) Provide gaining unit personnel to participate in:

(a) Inventory and handoff of equipment.

(b) Acceptance, to include the accountable Property Book Officer (PBO) or authorized representative, who will sign for the TC-AIMS II system.

(c) Provide required student personnel of appropriate Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) for NET.


(5) Provide the TC-AIMS II facility infrastructure (classroom/admin) space as required during the deployment and fielding process.

(6) Prepare and submit the Post Fielding Evaluation Report (DA Form 5666-R; Gaining Command Evaluation) for the gaining units.

5. ACCEPTANCE. Upon completion of the system serviceability and functional testing and inventories of the systems by the PM TC-AIMS II Chief of Installation and gaining unit representatives, the unit Property Book Officer or designated representative with valid signature card and/or appointment orders, will accept and sign for the system. This signature acknowledges receipt of the system, and that the system is complete and operational.

6. **IMPLEMENTATION.** This Materiel Fielding Agreement will become effective upon signature by all parties. This agreement will be reviewed as required and may be amended at any time by mutual consent. This MFA will be re-negotiated should proof of type classification not be provided as part of the Material Release Review Board.


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
